Who We Are

The mission of Senior Services of Albany (SSA) & Cohoes Multi-Service Senior Center (CMSSC) is to foster independence and enhance the quality of life of older adults by providing innovative services and caregiver support. We offer choice, independence and dignity and work to help our elders age in place wherever they wish to reside.

SSA & CMSSC provides:

- Senior Center Enrichment programs and activities including recreation, socialization, and educational opportunities
- Nutrition sites provide a hot, nutritious lunch and weekly dinners often augmented with entertainment at Westview, South Mall Towers, Hilltown Senior Center, Cohoes Multi-Service Senior Center, and Watervliet Senior Center.
- **Transportation services** including medical rides, lift-equipped wheelchair vans, senior center-to-home shuttle, and vans available to take senior groups on recreational trips and rides for grocery shopping purposes.
- **Cohoes and Newgate Social Adult Day Programs** provide supervision, socialization and stimulation to the physically and mentally frail senior and respite to the overwhelmed caregiver.
- *Meals on Wheels Service* provides a delicious homemade hot meal to over 800 seniors each day. Many also get a cold "lunch type meal" for later in the day. This service makes a huge difference for some of our most frail elderly neighbors. All our meals are made from scratch and provide each senior with 1/3 to 2/3 of the daily recommended nutritional requirements.
- *Health and Wellness programs* provide education and strategies for maintaining optimum health. We offer a variety of programs including evidence-based seminars on fall prevention, aging well, and more.
- *Community Care Management* provides hands-on assistance to isolated elderly individuals living in the City of Albany in need of assistance with life transitions or care coordination to improve quality of life.
- The Caregiver Connection provides educational opportunities and intensive personalized counseling to caregivers at home or in the workplace, as well as conducting telephone support groups for adult children and spousal caregivers of the elderly across the Capital Region.



Programs are funded in part by the Albany County Department for Aging, New York State Office for the Aging, the Albany Housing Authority and the City of Albany.



Understanding Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

Seniors are at higher risk of developing lung diseases such as chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), a disease that clogs, hardens, or destroys the tiny air ducts (sacs) inside the lungs. After age 55, the muscles around the lungs weaken over time, and the airways, muscles, and bones in the area shift, making breathing harder. For seniors over 75, one-fifth of hospitalizations are due to COPD, so it's important to know the symptoms and understand your risk.



COPD causes increased mucus, wheezing, shortness of breath, chest tightness, and other symptoms. Smoking is the

leading cause of COPD, but some people can get sick by breathing in chemical fumes, dust, or polluted air.

It is important for you to be tested for COPD by a doctor. Spirometry is a test that checks how well your lungs work by measuring how much air you breathe in and out, and how fast you breathe out the air. A doctor may also recommend other tests (chest X-rays, CT scans, or an arterial blood gas analysis) to check how your lungs are working.

If you've been diagnosed with COPD, a healthier lifestyle that includes a good diet and exercise can help you breathe and feel better. Doctors may also order treatment or medication. For smokers, quitting smoking is the most important first step. Talk with your doctor about getting the shot to prevent pneumonia (pneumococcal vaccine) and the flu shot, which could help with protecting your lungs.





The ABCs (and Ds) of Medicare Choices

Fidelis Care encourages seniors and their families to compare the different products available to them for 2018 Medicare Advantage coverage before Medicare open enrollment ends on December 7.

"It's important for seniors to find the Medicare Advantage product that best meets their needs," explained Pamela Hassen, Fidelis Care Chief Marketing Officer. "At Fidelis Care, we know that researching Medicare plans isn't always as simple as A-B-C, which is why we try to provide as many tools and resources as possible to help people make the best decision for themselves."

When comparing Medicare Advantage plans, Hassen offers the following research tips:



Add up all possible costs. Consider the monthly premiums, co-pays, coinsurance, deductibles, and out-of-pocket maximums each plan presents to estimate your possible costs in 2018. Fidelis Care Medicare Advantage members can look up their past claims online using the Member Portal, to estimate how much they spent on health care within the previous year.



Balance the price with your health care needs. The Medicare Advantage option you select should offer a good value. For example, some plans have higher monthly premiums but low co-pays for provider visits, while others have no monthly premium, but higher co-pays. Determine what works best for you based on your budget and how often you might need health care.



Check your medications. Always take a look at the plan's drug formulary to see if your medications are included, as well as how much they will cost you under the plan you are considering. Talk with your provider if you have questions.



Decide on your providers. Make sure the doctors and hospitals you want will accept the plan that you choose. Further, if you're considering switching providers, make sure they are conveniently located.

Medicare Advantage, also referred to as "Part C" coverage, is a different way to get your Medicare coverage. In addition to your Medicare "Part A" (Hospital) and "Part B" (Medical) coverage, Medicare Advantage products may offer additional benefits such as an over-the-counter debit card and a flexible reimbursement account. Dual Advantage is designed for those individuals who qualify for both Medicare and Medicaid coverage. These plans offer comprehensive coverage with little or no cost sharing for the member for covered medical services.


